
This year's AGM:

The theme of this year's AGM surrounds Indiana Soccer's partnership with the Positive Coaching Alliance. I invite all members to take advantage of the valuable sessions that will be available at this year's Annual General Meeting.

The in-school initiative: The in-school initiative, referenced as futsal-for-all, has made great strides this past year. Your state association submitted a grant request to US Soccer and FIFA to partner with Indiana to fund this initiative. US Soccer found favor with the grant request and agreed to provide \$200,000 over three years to reimburse Indiana Soccer for the cost incurred to implement Futsal for All in any participating school in Indiana. As of this writing, nearly 300,000 students have been impacted by this initiative. There are approximately 1.1 million children in either public or private schools in Indiana. The three-year goal that was articulated in the grant request is to affect 600,000 of these students by the end of 2026. Most of us realize the value that the small-sided game delivers from the many physical and cognitive benefits as well as the opportunity to fall in love with our game. Many of these new game lovers will seek more playing opportunities and will become players of a member club.

Member clubs are invited to help connect your state association with your school district with the goal of partnering with your school district to implement Futsal for All. Participating schools allow Indiana Soccer to provide formal futsal training for their physical education teachers. Participating teachers earn three "Professional Growth Points (PGPs)." PGPs are required by the state of Indiana to maintain an Indiana Teachers License so there is a need for teachers to embrace the free education provided by Indiana Soccer. Participating schools receive a pair of portable futsal goals and as many as ten futsal balls for each gymnasium. This initiative is being offered at no charge to participating school corporations. Each club member is asked to help with this initiative by identifying the decision-maker(s) in your school corporation and then helping to introduce Indiana Soccer to that decision-maker. 
Referee Development:

The Indiana State Referee Committee consists of a group of highly resolute volunteers, committed to supporting referees from their first rec game to the first pro game. Tony Crush is Indiana's State Referee Administrator (SRA), and Tom Berger is Indiana's State Youth Referee Administrator (SYRA). Indiana is fortunate that both gentlemen have agreed to serve as leaders of an equally talented State Referee Committee (SRC). These committed referees are anxious to develop a more seamless relationship with member clubs so that we can populate all games, regardless of the level of play, with appropriately skilled referees. Indiana Soccer, to further support and supplement referee development, has developed a small-sided soccer course that licenses an individual to referee any small-sided, sanctioned game played in the state of Indiana. Indiana Soccer's small-sided referee focuses on preparing folks on how to referee small-sided play by teaching the nuances and demands of small-sided play. The course has a written/digital learning component and a valuable on-field portion. Indiana's small-sided license is an excellent segway into the US Soccer referee license. Indiana Soccer also offers a Guardian of the Game course. The Guardian of the Game course instructs adult club volunteers on how to assist the center referee when a licensed assistant referee is unavailable. Each travel team should have at least two adults that have become **Guardians of the Game**.
